vs

Igor Nakvasin

The Court,

Having seen the charges against Igor Nakvasin, and holder of Russian Passport bearing no 71 1979630

Charged with having in these islands on the 16th June, 2016 at around 03:15hrs in St Julians or in the vicinity:

- Reviled or threatened or caused a bodily harm to PS 1349 Ranier Agius and PC 1372 Alain Cutajar, persons lawfully charged with a public duty, while in the act of discharging their duty or because of them having discharged such duty, or with intent to intimidate or unduly influence them in the discharge of such duty;
- Been found drunk and incapable of taking care of himself or in any public place or place open to the public.
- Wilfully disturbed the public peace and order.
- Loitered in a public place whilst holding or having on his person a glass container.

Having seen that the defendant admitted the charges brought against him, and that he confirmed this admission of guilt even after having been given time to reconsider his plea.

Having seen the documents filed by the prosecuting officer.

Having heard the submissions regarding the penalty to be meted out.

Having considered

That defendant admitted the charges brought against him; these are consequently sufficiently proven.

With regards to the penalty to be meted out the Court took into consideration the nature of the offences of which the defendant is being found guilty, his cooperation with the investigating officer, his admission at the earliest stage of these proceedings and his clean conviction sheet.

Wherefore the Court, after having seen sections 95 and 338(dd)(ff) of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta and section 3 of Subsidiary Legislation 52.1.2008, on his admission finds defendant guilty of the charges brought against him and condemns him to four (4) months imprisonment which by application of section 28A of the said Chapter 9 are being suspended for a period of two (2) years, and to a fine of eight hundred Euros (€800) which is to be paid within two days.

The Court explained to the defendant in ordinary language the significance of this judgement and of the consequences should he commit an other offence in the period of two years.
