

## COURTS OF MAGISTRATES (MALTA) AS A COURT OF CRIMINAL JUDICATURE

Today Saturday 30th July, 2016

The Court,

Having seen the charges brought against the accused **Nussbaum Yannick** holder of Swiss ID card number E2708390 and **Roth Joel Boris** holder of Swiss ID card number C7332654 accused with having on these islands on the 28rd July, 2016, some time between six and eight in the morning (0600 - 0800hrs), in Sliema, Malta

a) wilfully committed damage upon various vehicles, where the amount of the damage exceeds the sum of two hundred and fifty Euros (€250.00) but does not exceed the sum of two thousand and five hundred Euros (€2500.00) in breach of Section 325(b) of Chap 9 of the Laws of Malta.

b) moreover, for having on the same date place time and circumstances, wilfully disturbed the public good order or the public peace in breach of Section 338(dd) of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta,

Having seen that the defendants admitted the charges brought against them and that they confirmed this admission of guilt even after having been given time to reconsider their plea.

Having seen the documents filed by the prosecuting officer.

Having heard the submissions regarding the penalty to be meted out.

## Having considered:

That defendants admitted the charges brought against them; these are consequently sufficiently proven.

With regards to the penalty to be meted out the Court took into consideration the nature of the offences of which the defendants are being found guilty, their cooperation with the investigating officer, their admission at the earliest stage of these proceedings and their clean conviction sheet.

Wherefore the Court after having seen sections 325(b) and 338(dd) of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta on their admission finds defendants guilty of the charges brought against them, and conditionally discharges them by application of the Provision of Section 22 (1) of Chapter 446 of the Laws of Malta on condition that said accused Nussbaum Yannick and Roth Joel Boris commits no offence during the period of two (2) years as from today. Furthermore and by application of section 24 of Chapter 446 of the Laws of Malta the Court is ordering defendants to

pay the injured party the total sum of five hundred and thirty Euros (€530);

payment is to be effected within twenty four hours.

The Court explained to the defendants in ordinary language the significance of this

judgement and of the consequences should they fail to observe the conditions

imposed.
