Harvey Harry Hawkins.

## The Court;

Having seen the charges laid against Harvey Harry Hawkins, son of Peter and Ruth nee`Littlejohn, born in England on the 24<sup>th</sup> January, 1996, resides at Villa Belvedere, Triq Zejni, Madliena, Swieqi.

Charged with having in these islands on the 9<sup>th</sup> July, 2016 at about three in the morning (03:00 a.m.) in St. George's Road, St. Julian's and/or in the vicinity:

 Assaulted or resisted by violence or active force not amounting to public violence, persons lawfully charged with a public duty when in the execution of the law or of a lawfully order issued by a competent authority. (Art. 96 Chapter 9 of The Laws of Malta)

- 2. Accusing him further with having on the same date, time, place and circumstances reviled, threatened or caused bodily harm on the persons lawfully charged with a public duty, while in the act of discharging his duty or because of having discharged such duty, or with intent to intimidate or unduly influence them in the discharge of such duty. (Art. 95 Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta)
- Accusing him further with having on the same date, time, place and circumstances committed slight bodily harm on the person of PC 27 Alan Zahra (Art 221 Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta)
- Accusing him further with having on the same date, time, place and circumstances willfully disturbed the public good order or the public peace. (Art. 338(dd) Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta)
- 5. Accusing him further with having on the same date, time, place and circumstances disobeyed the lawful orders of any authority or of person entrusted with a public service, or hindered or obstructed such persons in the exercise of their duties. (Art. 338(ee) Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta)
- Accusing him further with having on the same date, time, place and circumstances was found drunk in a public place or a place open to the public. (Art. 338 (ff) Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta)

Having heard the accused admits to all the accusations being made against him and apologies for all the inconvenience he caused and undertook not to repeat such instances ever again.

Having seen Articles 95, 96, 221, 338(dd), 338(ee) and 338 (ff) of Chapter 9 of The Laws of Malta.

In view of the above, the Court finds him guilty of the all the accusations made against him and fines him a *multa* of four thousand Euros ( $\leq$ 4000), payable by next Monday the 11<sup>th</sup> July, 2016, as well as condemns him to a period of imprisonment of six months suspended for two years.

The Court is retaining the possession of the passport until the accused pays the fine next Monday, following the payment of which, the passport will be released to the accused.
