Nouman Mukhtar El-Ageli

The Court,

Having seen the charges against Nouman Mukhtar El-Ageli, 43 years, British National, born in USA on the 20th December 1973, son of Mukhtar and Filitima nee Benmusa, residing in 37 D, Greville Road, London NW6 5JB and holder of British passport no 306663585.

Charged with having on the 30th May 2017 and in the previous days in Malta while having in his possession a document issued by a competent authority, that is four Libyan passports, transferred these documents to another person or received these documents which were transferred to him by another person.

Having heard defendant admit the charge brought against him.

Having seen the acts of the proceedings.

Having heard the submissions regarding the penalty to be meted out.

Having considered

The defendant admitted the charge brought against him; this is consequently sufficiently proved.

With regards the penalty to be meted out the Court took into consideration the nature of the charge brought against defendant on the one hand, and on the other hand the circumstances which led defendant to be in possession of the documents, defendant's co-operation with the police and his admission at the earliest stage of the proceedings.

Wherefore the Court, after having seen section 3 of Chapter 61 of the Laws of Malta, on his admission finds defendant guilty of the charge brought against him and by application of section 22 of Chapter 446 of the Laws of Malta discharges him on condition that he does not commit another offence in the period of one year.

The Court explained to the defendant in ordinary language the significance of this judgement and of the consequences should he commit an other offence in the period of one year.
