Today, 8<sup>th</sup> July 2017,

The Court;

Having seen the accusations brought against:

**Chloe Elizabeth Dunne**, holder of passport no. PR 5079124;

**Charged** with having in these islands on the 30<sup>th</sup> May 2017 at about two in the morning (02:00a.m) in St. Julian's and/or in the vicinity:-

1. Without the intent to kill or to put the life in manifest jeopardy, caused grievous bodily harm on the person of

Charles Micallef (*Art. 216(1)(a)(b) Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta*);

The Court is kindly requested that if the accused is found guilty to provide for the safety of Charles Micallef according to article 383, Chapter 9 of the Criminal Law.

Having heard the guilty plea of the accused, as duly registered in today's sitting being the first sitting of these proceedings;

Having seen the records of the case;

Having heard the submissions made by the Prosecution and by the defence;

Having duly considered all the records of the case and all submissions made;

Finds the accused guilty as charged;

Having seen Article 216 (1)(a)(b) of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta, the Court deals with the accused by conditionally discharging her with the specific condition that she does not commit any other offence within a period of three (3) months from today in terms of article 22 of Chapter 446 of the laws of Malta.

The Court also binds the accused with a recognizance in favour of the said Charles Micallef, in the amount of three hundred Euro (€300) and this for a period of six (6) months.

The Court explained to the accused her obligations arising out of this judgement.
