Joshua David Williamson

Today, 8th July 2017,

The Court;

Having seen the accusations brought against:

Joshua David Williamson, holder of Passport number 46291843;

Charged with having, on the 08th July 2017 at around 06:30hrs, in Triq il-Knisja, St. Julian's:

1. Reviled, or threatened, or caused a bodily harm to any person lawfully charged with a public duty, while in the

act of discharging his duty or because of his having discharged such duty, or with intent to intimidate or unduly influence him in the discharge of such duty;

- Wilfully committed any spoil, damage or injury to or upon any movable or immovable property belonging to any other person, this being Police Uniforms of Police Sergeant PS750, which amount of damage does not exceed twenty three Euros and twenty nine cents (€23.29);
- in any public place or place open to the public, were found drunk and incapable of taking care of themselves;

Having heard the guilty plea of the accused, as duly registered in today's sitting being the first sitting of these proceedings;

Having seen the records of the case;

Having heard the submissions made by the Prosecution and by the defence;

Having duly considered all the records of the case and all submissions made;

Finds the accused guilty as charged;

Having seen Art. 95, 325 (1) (d), 338 (ff) of Ch. 9 of the Laws of Malta, the Court condemns the accused to a fine (multa) of eight hundred Euro (\in 800) and orders him to pay eight Euro and ninetynine cents (\in 8.99)

expenses in respect of the replacement of the damaged Police Uniform trousers.

The Court explained to the accused his obligations arising out of this judgement.
