Today, 27th July 2017,

The Court:

Having seen the accusations brought against:

Milika Makragic, holder of Serbian passport number 011053327;

Charged with having on the 26th July 2017 in Malta while having in her possession Bulgarian Passports or Identity Cards in the names of Marko Pertovich and Milosh Jankovski bearing numbers 642374154 and 644525124, had transferred this document to another person or received this document which was

transferred to her by another person (Cap 61, Sec 3 of the Laws of Malta).

Having heard the guilty plea of the accused, as duly registered in today's sitting being the first sitting of these proceedings;

Having seen the records of the case;

Having heard the submissions made by the Prosecution and by the defence;

Having duly considered all the records of the case and all submissions made;

Having warned the accused of the legal consequences of such guilty plea and having given the accused further time to reconsider her guilty plea and having heard the accused reconfirm her guilty plea during her arraignment before this Court;

Finds the accused guilty as charged;

Therefore:

The Court, after having seen Article 3 of Chapter 61 of the Laws of Malta finds the accused guilty as charged and condemns the accused to six months imprisonment which upon the application of Section 28A of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta are being suspended for two years.

The Courts explained to the accused her obligations arising out of this judgement.
