The Court,

Having seen that the accused Ovidijus Aleliunas holder of Lithuanian Passport number 24361066 was charged with having on the 7th October 2017, at around 00:30hrs, in St. George's Street, St. Julian's:

Without intent to kill or to put the life of Alhaj Ali Adnan Mohamed Ali in manifest jeopardy, caused grievous injuries to the body of Alhaj Ali Adnan Mohamed. (Art. 214, 215, 216 of Chap. 9 of the Laws of Malta)

Further accused with, on the same date, time and circumstances, without intent to kill or to put the life of Emad Younis in manifest jeopardy, caused harm to his body or health, which injuries were certified of being of slight nature; (Art. 214, 215, 221)

Having seen all documentation in relation to the case.

Having seen that the accused pleaded guilty from the beginning of the proceedings to all charges brought against him and reconfirmed such plea after being given the opportunity to reconsider his plea.

Having seen that his conviction sheet is clean and seen that he co-operated fully with the prosecution.

On the above basis finds accused Ovidijus Aleliunas guilty of the charges brought against him and by virtue of Article 28A Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta condemns him to one year imprisonment suspended for three (3) years.

Finally, explained in simple words the repercussions if such order is not complied with.
