Maja Zdravkovic

Today, the 8th of November, 2017

The Court,

Having seen that the accused Maja Zdravkovic, holder of Serbian Passport 9880494.

Was charged with having on the 7th November, 2017 and the period prior to this date in these islands, committed any other kind of forgery, or have knowingly made use of any other forged document, in the mentioned documents (Cap 9, Sec 189 of the Laws of Malta)

And charged her also with having on same period, time and circumstances, altered or tampered with a Passport, or used or had in his possession a Passport, which he knew to be forged, altered or tempered with, (Cap 61, Sec 5 of the Laws of Malta)

And charged her also with having on same period, time and circumstances without lawful authority used or had in his possession any document required for the purposes of this Act which is forged; or (Cap 217, Sec 32 (1f) of the Laws of Malta)

Seen that the accused Maja Zdravkovic whereby she pleaded guilty to all the charges brought against her and co-operated fully with the Prosecution.

Seen that accused will be immediately repatriated to the country of origin. On the above basis this Court is not going to impose of judgment of effective imprisonment.

Therefore after seeing Article 189 of Chapter 9, Article 5 of Chapter 61 and Article 32(1f) of Chapter 217 of the Laws of Malta, finds accused Maja Zdravkovic guilty of all the charges brought against her and by virtue of Article 28A of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta condemns her to six (6) months imprisonment suspended for eighteen (18) months.

Finally explained in simple words to the accused Maja Zdravkovic, the repercussions if such order is not complied with.
