VS

Abdel Wahab Adam Kevin

The Court,

Having seen the charges brought against Abdel Wahab Adam Kevin, a Danish national born on the 14/10/1991 in Kobenhavn, son of Adbukat and Barra, residing at 26 Dar Pascal, Triq Marsalforn Xaghra Gozo, holder of Danish 207050846.

Charged with having on the 15th March 2021 between 12:00 and 13:00 at the Malta International Airport:

- 1. threatened Lufthansa manager Joseph Mifsud with the use of violence in order to compel to do such duty;
- 2. attempted to use force against Lufthansa manager Joseph Mifsud with intent to insult, annoy or hurt such person or others, duty;

- 3. intentionally obstructed an authorised officer (MIA security) acting in the exercise of a power conferred on him by or under Part III of Chapter 405;
- 4. publicly uttered any obscene or indecent words, or made obscene acts or gestures;
- 5. with having on the same date, time, place and circumstances, wilfully disturbed the public good order or the public peace; and
- 6. with having on the same date, time, place and circumstances, even though in a state of intoxication, publicly uttered any obscene or indecent words, or made obscene acts or gestures, or in any other manner not otherwise provided for in this Code, offended against public morality, propriety or decency.

Having seen the consent of the Attorney Geneal for this case to be heard summarily before this Court sitting as a Court of Criminal Judicature and that the defendant had no objection to the case being so heard.

Having seen that the defendant admitted the charges brought against him and confirmed this admission of guilt even after having been given time to reconsider this plea.

Having heard the submissions of the parties regarding the penalty to be meted out.

Having seen the acts of the proceedings.

Having considered

That the defendant admitted the charges brought against him; these are consequently sufficiently proven.

With regards the penalty to be meted out the Court took into consideration on the one hand the nature of the charges of which defendant is being found guilty, and on the other hand his cooperation with the police, and his admission at the earliest stage of the porceedings. Wherefore, the Court after having seen sections 251(1), 338(bb)(dd), 339(1)(d) and 342 of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta and section 19(1)(a) of Chaoter 405 of the Laws of Malta, on his admission finds defendant guilty of the charges brought against him and condemns him to one (1) year imprisonment which by application of section 28A of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta is being suspended for a period of two (2) years and to a fine of two hundred Euros (€200).

The Court explained to the defendant in ordinary language the significance of this judgement and of the consequences should he commit an other offence in the period of two years.
