Georgi Stefanov Naidenov (Id card no. 408312L)

The Court,

After having seen the charges brought against Georgi Stefanov Naidenov of 51 years, son of Stefan and Anei nee' Slavceva, born in Bulgaria on the 2nd of March 1972, residing in Caroline Blk B, Flat 16, St. Anthony Street, St. Paul's Bay and holder of Maltese Id card number 408312L.

Being charged of having on the 6th of July 2023 at around 23:00hrs, at Main Street, Mgarr (Malta) :

- 1. Without the intent to kill or to put the life of Volcan Tayli in manifest jeopardy, caused the mentioned grievous bodily harm in breach of Articles 216 of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta;
- 2. On the same date, time and place, disturbed the repose of the inhabitants by rowdiness or bawling, or in any other manner in breach of Article 338(dd) of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta.

The Court is being humbly requested to provide the needed security in favour of Volcan Tayli even during these proceedings in terms of Article 412C of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta.

The Court is also being kindly requested that if the accused is found guilty, condemns the same to the payment, wholly or in part, to the registrar, of the costs incurred in connection with the employment in the proceedings of any expert or referee in terms of Article 533 of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta.

Having seen all the documents presented in the acts of the proceedings.

Having seen that the accused registered a guilty plea to all the charges brought against him during the sitting of the 1st February 2024.

Having heard submissions of both parties regarding the punishment.

Considered

Whereas during the sitting held on the 1st February 2024, in the presence of his Lawyer, the accused pleaded guilty to all the charges brought against him, notwithstanding the fact that the Court warned him in the most solemn manner of the legal consequences of his guilty plea, and after having given him sufficient time within which to reconsider and withdraw his guilty plea.

Having heard the accused reiterate his guilty plea, after the court warned him of the punishment and consequences such an admission entailed.

Having heard the guilty plea of the accused to all the charges brought against him, the Court has no alternative but to declare the accused guilty of the said charges.

Considered

The guilty plea of the accused at the initial stages of these proceedings and his clean conviction sheet.

<u>Decide</u>

For the said reasons the Court, after having seen Article 7, 31, 216 and 338(dd) of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta, **finds the accused Georgi Stefanov Naidenov guilty** of all the charges brought against him, and by application of **Article 22** of Chapter 446 of the Laws of Malta, **is discharging the offender subject to the condition that he commits no offence for the period of three (3) years** starting from today.

In accordance with **Article 22(3)** of Chapter 446 of the Laws of Malta, the Court explained to the offender in plain language that if he commits another offence during the period of conditional discharge, the offender will be liable to be sentenced for the original offence.

Also in terms of **Article 412C** of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta, the Court is issuing a **Protection Order** against the offender **Georgi Stefanov Naidenov** for a period of **three (3) years** from today for the protection of **Volcan Tayli.** The Court explained to the offender **Georgi Stefanov Naidenov** in plain language, his liabilities according to the conditions imposed by the Protection Order, which decree is being attached to this judgement, also forming an integral part of the same judgement.

The Court is ordering that a copy of this Judgement together with the Protection Order Decree is notified to the Commissioner of Police.

The Court is also ordering that in accordance with Article 392A(2) of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta, the Attorney General is given access to a scanned copy of the Acts of the Proceedings together with a scanned copy of the Judgement within six(6) working days.
