**The Court,**

Having seen that Ana Ramadanova, born on the 26<sup>th</sup> August 1990 in Macedonia, residing 124, The Oaks, Fl 8, Triq tas-Sliema, and holder of identity card bearing number 258958A was accused of having on the 29<sup>th</sup> July 2024 and/or in the preceding months in the Maltese Islands, at different times, through several acts committed, even if at different times, and which constitute violations of the same provision of the law, and committed in pursuance of the same design (Art. 18 Ch.9):

1. Pursued a course of conduct which amounts to the harassment of Kirsten Camilleri and which you knew or ought to know that this amounts to harassment. Art 251A(1)(a)(b) Ch. 9.
2. By your course of conduct, caused Kirsten Camilleri to fear that violence would be used against her or against her property or against the person or property of any of her ascendants, descendants, brothers or other relatives. Art.251B(1) Ch. 9

Having seen that on the 11<sup>th</sup> of December 2024 after the prosecuting officer read and confirmed the charges on oath, the accused pleaded not guilty, however during today's sitting the accused registered a guilty plea.

Having seen the acts of the case.

Having heard the defence counsel and the prosecuting officer's final oral submissions in relation to the punishment which may be inflicted upon the accused.

### **Considerations**

In view of the accused's voluntary admission, the Court has no other option but to find the accused guilty of the charges brought against her. In awarding punishment the Court considered the circumstances of the case and of the accused.

### **Conclusion**

For these reasons, the Court, having seen articles 251A(1)(a)(b) and 251B(1) of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta, upon the admission of the accused Ana Ramadanova, holder of identity card bearing number 258958A, finds the said accused guilty of all the charges brought against her, and since the Court is of the opinion that, having regard to the circumstances of the case, and the nature of the offence, and the character of the offender, it is not expedient to impose a sentence, and the other orders in Chapter 446 of the Laws of Malta are not appropriate, the Court acquits the accused Ana Ramadanova, holder of identity card bearing number 258958A, on condition that she does not commit any offence during the period of eighteen (18) months from the date of this order.

Furthermore, the Court, having regard to articles 382A and 412C of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta, orders the issuance of a Restraining Order against the offender Ana Ramadanova, holder of identity card bearing number 258958A, in favour of Kirsten Camilleri for a period of three (3) years from today, in accordance with the conditions set out in the decree of this Court of today and which forms an integral part of this judgment.

The Court orders notification of this sentence and of the Restraining Order to the Commissioner of Police and to the injured party.
