

## COURT OF MAGISTRATES (MALTA) AS A COURT OF CRIMINAL JUDICATURE

The Police (Inspector Joseph Mercçca) vs Dean Leonard Harley, son of John, born in England on the 26<sup>th</sup> July, 1970

The Court,

Having seen the charges profferred against the accused with having on the  $6^{th}$  July, 2003, at about 6.00 p.m., at Qawra –

1. caused injuries of a grevious nature on the person of Joseph Muscat, as certified by Dr. Andrej Grubor M.D. of St. Luke's Hospital;

2. wifully disturbed the public good order and\or the public peace;

3. without inflicting any wound or blow, threatened others with stones or other hard substances, or thrown the same against Catherine Muscat.

The Court has been requested to provide for the safety of Joseph Muscat and Catherine Muscat in terms of Section 383 of the Criminal Code.

Having seen the records of the case of the 7<sup>th</sup> July, 2003 whereby the accused admitted to all the charges as profferred.

Consequently, the Court finds him guilty of the charges as profferred. Having seen sections 216(1)(d), 338(dd) and 339(1)(b) of the Criminal Code. The Court does not condemn him to a period of imprisonment but sets him free under the provisions of section 22 of Chapter 446 of the Laws of Malta on condition that he commits no further offence for a period of three years from today. In the circumstances, there is no need to apply the provisions of section 383 of the Criminal Code.
