ADRIAN CHARLES EDWIN CROSSLEY

The Court;

After having seen the imputations brought against Adrian Charles Edwin Crossely, aged 32 years, son of Ronald Victor and Betty nee' Warol, born in Margate, England, on the 10th October, 1973 and temporary residing in Malta at the Porto Azzuro Apartment Hotel, Triq ir-Ridott, St Paul's Bay, with fixed address in Englang being 33, Highfields Market Road, Drayton Shropshire, UK, holder of British passport number 040515914; Kopja Informali ta' Sentenza

After having on these island, in St Paul's Bay, in the early hours of the 5th September, 2005, at around 0200hrs:

1. Reviled, or threatened, or caused bodily harm to persons lawfully with a public duty, while in the act of discharging their duty or because of having discharged such duty, or with intent to intimidate or unduly influence them in the discharge of such duty in breach of Section 95 of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta;

2. Moreover, for having on the same day, time and circumstances when so required, to give information thereof, or gives false information or particulars, to any person entrusted with a public service in the actual exercise of his duties in breach of Section 338 (c) & (g) of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta

3. Moreover, for having on the same day time and circumstances disturbed the repose of the inhabitants by rowdiness or bawling or in any other manner in breach of Section 338 (m) of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta;

4. Moreover for having on the same day time and circumstances when in a state of intoxication, publicly uttered obscene or indecent words and made obscene acts or gesture or in any other manner not other wise provided for in this Code, offended against public morality, propriety or decency in breach of Section 338 (bb) of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta;

5. And in any other manner not otherwise provided for in this Code, willfully disturbed the public good order or the public peace in breach in Section 338 (dd) of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta;

6. Disobeyed the lawful orders of any authority or of any person entrusted with a public service, hindered or obstructed such persons in the exercise of his duties, in

breach of Section 338 (ee) of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta

After having heard the accused enter a guilty plead to the charges brought against him;

After having heard the accused apologize to the police officers for his behaviour at the time of the incident;

After having seen the Articles 95, , 338(c), (g), (m), (bb), (dd), and (ee) of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta.

Finds the accused guilty as charged and condemns him to a fine (multa) of Lm70.00 (seventy maltese liri).
