

## COURT OF MAGISTRATES (MALTA) AS A COURT OF CRIMINAL JUDICATURE

## MAGISTRATE DR. ANTONIO MIZZI

The Police (Inspector Sandro Zarb) vs Augustine Weah, son of Augustine,Born in Monrovia, Liberia on the 14<sup>th</sup> February, 1988

## The Court,

Having seen the charges profferred against the accused – 1. with having on the 7<sup>th</sup> July, 2005 and \or on the previous days in Malta, forged, altered or tampered with a passport or used or had in his possession a passport which he knew to be forged, altered or tampered with, being an identity card of the Kingdom of the Netherlands issued in the name of Luilly Ramirez, bearing number T78725125;

with having on the same date and in the same circumstances in Malta, knowingly, made use of a forged document being the above mentioned identity card;
 with having on the same date and in the same circumstances in Malta, made use of, or attempted to make use of a passport issued to any other person.

Having seen the records of the case of the 13<sup>th</sup> July, 2005 where the accused admitted to the charges as profferred.

Consequently, the Court finds the accused guilty of the charges as profferred. Having seen section 189 of the Criminal Code and sections 5 and 11 of Chapter 61 of the Laws of Malta. Having considered that the accused is a minor with a clean conduct sheet does not commit him to a term of imprisonment but sets him free under section 22 of Chapter 446 of the Laws of Malta on condition that he commits no offence for a period of one year from today.
