The Police (Inspector Mario Haber) vs Mustafa Bulut

Today the 9th of December 2005

THE COURT

Having seen the charges brought against the accused with having on the 8th of December 2005:

- 1. In these islands, forged, altered or tampered with a passport, or used or had in his possession, a passport which he new to be forged, altered or tampered with, bieng possport of Greece, issued in the name of Makarios Bulut bearing number B200978.
- 2. Having on the same day and circumstances, in Malta, knowingly made use of a forged document being the above mentioned document.

Having heard the accused, of his own free will, declare to be guilty as charged.

Finds the accused guilty of having on the 8th of December 2005:

- 1. In these islands, forged, altered or tampered with a passport, or used or had in his possession, a passport which he new to be forged, altered or tampered with, bieng possport of Greece, issued in the name of Makarios Bulut bearing number B200978.
- 2. Having on the same day and circumstances, in Malta, knowingly made use of a forged document being the above mentioned document.

Having seen Article 5 of Chapter 61 of the Laws of Malta, as well as Article 189 of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta.

In regard to punishment, the Court, having heard the parties, and bearing in mind the young age of the accused is of the opinion it should apply Article 22 of Chapter 446 of the Laws of Malta.

The Court therefore, instead of the punishment specified by law, orders that the accused be set free on condition he commits no further offence within one year from today.

The prosecution kept in its possession the passport of the accused as well as the forged possport used by the accused.

The Court orders that the acts be sent to the Advocarte General.
