BEVERLEY JOYCE SCIBERRAS

The Court;

After having seen the charges brought against Beverley Joyce Sciberras, aged 49 years, wife of Martin, daughter of Victor Townsend, and Doris Tristram, born in UK, on the 7 of April, 1956, and residing at 77/79, Antonio Schembri Street, Kappara, holder of ID card number 186 503 L;

Accused of having of the 21 of February, 2006, at about 6.00pm, at Ta' Xbiex:

- a. Wilfully committed spoil and damage to vehicle Ford Transit DQZ 050 or upon any moveable or immovable property belonging to Godwin Mifusd, the amount of damages does not exceed five hundred maltese liri (Lm500.00) but exceeds fifty maltese liri (Lm50.00);
- b. And also of having on the same day, place, time and circumstances, withount infliction any wound or blow, threatened John Stilogoe with stones or other hard substances, or threw the same, or took up any other weapon against him;
- c. And als of having on the same day, time and place, uttered insults or threats or being provoked, carried her insult beyond the limit warranted by the provocation;
- d. And finally also of having on the same day, time, and place, even though in a state of intoxication, publicly uttered any obscene or indecent words, or made obscene acts or gestures or in any manner offended public morality, propriety, or decency.

After having seen Articles 325, 338, 339 of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta.

Considered:

After having heard the accused admit to the accusations at an early stage and confirmed such admission after having been given due time to reconsider his position according to Law;

This Courts therefore finds the said accused Beverley Joyce Sciberras guilty as charged, and discharges her from all charges brought against her on the condition that she does not commit any other crime from one (1) year from today, according to Section 22 of Chapter 446 of the Laws of Malta.

Moreover, this Court also order the said accused the ammont of Lm100.00 (hundred maltese liri), as damaged

suffered by Godwin Mifsud, in accordance with Article 24 of Chapter 446 of the Law of Malta.
