**THE COURT**

Having seen the charges brought against the accused with having in Malta, precisely in Mellieha, on the night of the 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> of July 2006, at some time, assaulted or resisted by violence or active force, not amounting to public violence, any person - that is PS 698 S Tabone, PC 111 M Camilleri, PC 60 J Grima, PC 409 J Zarb and PC 296 R Farrugia, lawfully charged with a public duty when in the execution of the law or of a lawfully order issued by a competent authority, and on the same day, time and circumstances, disobeyed the lawfull orders of

any authority of any person entrusted with a public service or hindered or obstructed such person in the exercise of his duties or otherwise unduly interfered with the exercise of such duties either by preventing other persons from doing what they are lawfully enjoined or allowed to do or frustrating or undoing what has been lawfully done by other persons or in any other manner whatsoever.

Having heard the accused plead guilty as charged.  
Having heard the submissions tendered by the parties.

Finds accused guilty of having in Malta, in precisely in Mellieha, on the night of the 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> of July 2006, at some time assaulted or resisted by violence or active force not amounting to public violence any person that is, PS 698 S Tabone, PC 111 M Camilleri, PC 60 J Grima, PC 409 J Zarb and PC 296 R Farrugia, lawfully charged with a public duty when in the execution of the law or of a lawfully order issued by a competent authority, and on the same day, time and circumstances, disobeyed the lawfull orders of any authority of any person entrusted with a public service or hindered or obstructed such person in the exercise of his duties or otherwise unduly interfered with the exercise of such duties either by preventing other persons from doing what they are lawfully enjoined or allowed to do or frustrating or undoing what has been lawfully done by other persons or in any other manner whatsoever.

Having seen articles 96 and 338(ee) of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta.

In regard to punishment the Court;

Having heard the submissions of the parties in regard punishment;

Having heard the accused plead guilty at an early stage of the proceedings;

Informal Copy of Judgement

Having seen Article 22 of Chapter 446 of the Laws of Malta;

Orders that the accused be set free on condition he does not commit any further offence within one year from today.
