The Police Insp Michael Mallia vs Milenko Curcin

The Court having seen the charge against Milenko Curcin, 23 years old, son of Ninoslav and Gorica nee Zupunski, born in Belgrade Sebia on the 2 December 1982 and residing at Sprachcaffe International Languages Plus, Alamein Road Pembroke St. Julian's, holder of Yugoslav passport bearing number 003906565.

Accused for having on these islands on the 11 October 2006 and during the previous months, knowingly received or purchased any property which has been stolen, misapplied or obtained by means of anyoffence, or knowingly took part, in any manner whatsoever, in the sale or disposal of same, which stolen property has been obtained by theft

aggravated by value exceeding one hundred Malta Liri and this with breaches of Article 334 of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta.

The Court, having considered all the acts of the file, having heard the accused plead guilty at an early stage of the proceedings and his confirmation of such guilty plea after enough time was given to him to reflect.

Considers,

That once defendant had pleaded guilty, then the charge has been proved in accordance with the law.

The Court after considering sections 261(c), 267 and 334 of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta declares that the defendant is guilty of the offence but once (a) he has returned the stolen property and (b) cooperated with the police and (c) filed an early guilty plea, instead of condemning him is discharging him on condition that he does not commit another offence in two years from now. The Court explained Section 22 of Chapter 446 of the Laws of Malta in simple terms to the defendant. The Court orders that the judgement be transmitted to the Attorney General's Office in accordance with the Law.
