## The Court

Having seen that the accused **STEVAN PAVLIC**, aged 30, sond of Peter and Slavojka nee Radojvic, born in Serbia on the 10<sup>th</sup> October, 1977 and residing at 3, Rue Jean Moinon, 75110, Paris, France, in possession of a travel document number 04162 was arrainged before her accused with having on the 19<sup>th</sup> February 2004 and during the previous days, assumed any public function, whether civil or military, without being entitled thereto, and performed any act thereof in breach of section 84 of Chapater 9 of the Laws of Malta.

Having heard the accused declare that he understands the English language well and that he understood the charges brought forward against him by the prosecution.

Having seen all the documents exhibited in the acts of these proceedings by the prosecution in particular the Attorney General's consent, the statement released by the same accused on the 21<sup>st</sup> October 2007, the true copy of the passport of the accused and the accused's conviction sheet.

Having seen the relevant sections at law in particular Section 84 of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta.

Having heard the accused plead guilty to the charges brought forward against him.

The Court explained to the accused the consequences of his plea of guilt and after having given the accused sufficient time to reconsider his plea of guilt and saw that the same accused insisted on registering in the acts of these proceedings his plea of guilt, had no alternative but to register such plea.

In the light of the above plea of guilt which guilty plea was made voluntarily, expressly and unconditionally, the Court is satisfied that the accused is to be found guilty of the charges brought forward against him.

The Court considered the fact that the prosecution declared that the accused corroborated during these procedures, that the crime in question took place three years ago and the accused has not caused any trouble since then, that the accused no longer lives in Malta and that today he is in full employment with the French Foreign Legion.

The Court also took note of the clean conduct sheet of the accused.

The Court is of the opinion that, after having regard of the circumstances of the case, including the nature of the offence and the character of the offender, decides to find the accused STEVAN PAVLIC guilty of the charge brought forward against him and decides to make an order discharging him subject to the condition that he commits no offence during a period of eighteen (18) months from today in terms of section 22(1) of Chapter 446 of the Laws of Malta.

The Court explained the importance of this judgment to the accused and what would happen should he fails to observe it and he declared he fully understood the importance of this judgment.
