## THE COURT

Having seen the charges brought against the accused with having on the 28<sup>th</sup> of August 2005 between 1700 and 1730 hours at the Mellieha Bay, without intention:

a) Caused grievous bodily harm on the person of Steve Rose Alan passport number 202697882UK as certified by Dr Chris Spiteri Med. Number 2770.

b) Through imprudence, negligence and through non observance of any regulation, caused grievous bodily harm.

Informal Copy of Judgement

Having heard the accused, of his own free will, plead guilty as charged.

Having seen the records of the proceedings.

Finds accused guilty of having on the 28<sup>th</sup> of August 2005 between 1700 and 1730 hours at the Mellieha Bay, without intention:

1. Caused grievous bodily harm on the person of Steve Rose Alan passport number 202697882UK as certified by Dr Chris Spiteri Med. Number 2770.

2. Through imprudence, negligence and through non observance of any regulation, caused grievous bodily harm.

Having seen Article 226 of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta.

In regard to the punishment to be inflicted, the Court, after having heard the parties, is the opinion it should apply Article 22 of Chapter 446 of the Laws of Malta.

Therefore the Court, instead of the punishment stipulated by Law, orders that the accused be set free on condition he does not commit any further offence within six(6) months from today.

The passport of the accused was returned to the prosecuting officer who in turn gave it to the accused in the presence of the Court.
