The Court;

Having seen the charges brought against:

Peter Michael King son of Peter Oliver and Susan *nee'* Tingey, born in Newham, England on the 24th March 1971 resident in Room 846, Hillton Hotel, Ross Street, St. Julians and holder of British passport no. 401161932; **Michael Lawson** son of Gerald and Maria *nee'* Schembri born in Sheppey, England on the 21st March 1974

resident in Room 846, Hillton Hotel, Ross Street, St. Julians and holder of British passport no. 194002788;

With having on these Islands on the night between the 18th and 19th March 2009 at about two thirty in the morning (02:30am) outside Going Places situated in Ball Street St. Julians:

- 1. Without the intent to kill or to put the life in manifest jeopardy, caused grievous bodily harm on the person of Reuben Cassar;
- 2. Peter Michael King alone is accused that on the same date, time and place without the intent to kill or to put the life in manifest jeopardy, caused grievous bodily harm on the person of Brian Vella
- 3. Willfully disturbed the public good order or the public peace;

The Court is kindly requested that if the accused are found guilty to provide for the safety of Rueben Cassar and Brian Vella according to article 383, Chapter 9 of the Criminal Law.

Having hear the plea of guilt;

Having seen the records of the case, find the accused guilty as charged;

Having seen articles 214, 216 (c) and 338 (dd) of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta;

Having seen the clean conduct sheet of the accused;

Discharges the accused with the condition that they do not commit any other offence within a period of three (3) years from today in terms of article 22 of Chapter 446 of the Laws of Malta;

The Court explained to the accused their obbligations arising out of this judgement and since the prosecution did not have the consent of the attorney general for this case

to be tried summarily, the Court orders that these acts be transmitted to the attorney general within the time prescribed by law;
