The Court;

After seeing the charges brought against:

Mark Anthony George Bennet of 18 years, son of John and Linda nee' Clarke, born in Enfield, United Kingdom, residing in Flat 15, Lily Flats, Upper Conversion Str, St. Paul's Bay and holder of a British passport no. 456654626;

For Having on the 22nd May 2009, in these islands;

Informal Copy of Judgement

- 1) Committed a theft of a Vehicle of the make Kia Piccanto bearing registration number KAK 738 from the Strand, Sliema to the detriment of Raymond Mifsud from Zebbug, theft which is aggravated by amount, time, and the nature of the thing stolen;
- 2) Also, from the premises styled as ' Executive Rentals', situated at the Strand, Sliema committed a theft of the key of vehicle bearing registration no. KAK 738 Kia Piccanto to the detriment of Raymond Mifsud of Zebbug, which theft is aggravated by time;
- 3) Also, for breaching the conditions imposed by Article 7 of Chapter 446 of the Law of Malta which were imposed on him by Magistrate Dr. D. Clarke LL.D on the 12th April 2008 when he was found guilty of aggravated theft.

Considers:

After having seen the Articles 261, 267, 270, 271, 279 of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta;
And Article 7 of Chapter 446 of the Laws of Malta;

After having heard the evidence and the documents exhibited;

After having heard the submissions raised by both parties in today's sitting;

After having heard the accused's plea of admission of guilt as charged;

After having given the time prescribed by Law for the accused to consider his plea;

After the said accused confirmed the said plea of guilt;

This Court finds the said accused guilty as charged and imposes on him a term of Probation of three years in accordance with Article 7 of Chapter 446 of the Law of Malta, under the conditions outlined therein.

The Court explained in clear words the terms of the judgement to the accused.
