**Ajose Adeogun Aderonke Abiola Simisola, born in
London (England) on the 24/04/1962, and temporary
residing at room 310, Qawra Inn, Tamar Street, Qawra,
and holder of passport number 540605838.**

The Court;

Having seen the charges brought against the accused
Ajose Adeogun Aderonke Abiola Simisola in that she:

On the 28/08/2009 at about 12.30pm., whilst at the Texas
Mini Market situated in Maskli Street, Qawra, reviled or
threatened P.C.525 Charlton Falzon Cascun and P.C.
1503 David Buhagiar, lawfully charged with public duty,
while in the act of discharging their duties or because of

them having discharged such duties, or with the intent to intimidate or unduly influence them in their discharge of such duties.

Moreover on the same date, time and place, disobeyed the Police lawful order and for having failed to give her particulars to the said Police Officers.

Furthermore, on the same date, time and place with the object of destroying or damaging reputation of the said Police Officers, offended them by words or in any other manner.

Having heard the accused file a guilty plea to the charges brought against her which guilty plea was reaffirmed after being given sufficient time to reconsider same.

Considers;

That in view of the guilty plea filed by accused, the Court finds the accused guilty as charged.

That in considering the punishment to be inflicted the Court is taking into consideration the guilty plea filed at this early stage of the proceedings and the fact that the accused apologized for her behavior.

The Prosecuting Officer's testimony reflects only a report filed by injured party Noel Mallia.

Consequently the Court after having seen Section 95 of the Criminal Code finds the accused guilty as charged and in view of the above mentioned considerations and after having seen Section 22 of Chapter 446 of the laws of Malta discharges the accused on condition that she does not commit another crime within one (1) year from today.,

The Court explained to accused the consequences according to law if she commits another crime during this period of conditional discharge.

Informal Copy of Judgement

Finally the Court orders that a copy of this sentence together with the acts of the proceedings be notified to the Attorney General according to law.
