Jeffrey Idoghu

The Court

Having seen the charges made against Jeffrey Idoghu, 23 years of age, son of Idoghu born in Nigeria in Benin City on the 1st January 1986 and detained at Safi Barracks, holder of police number 09E-033 and currently detained at the Floriana Lock up.

Charged for having on the 8th July 2009 and the months previous and later dates in Malta, made us or caused to

be made a false return, false statement or false representation and/or furnished the Principal Immigration Officer with false information, and this in violation of Article 32(1c) of Chapter 217 of the Laws of Malta.

Charged also under the same circumstances for having committed any other kind of forgery or knowingly made use of any other forged document, and this in violation of Article 189 of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta.

Charged also for having in the month of June 2009, while detained at the Safi Barracks in Safi, escaped from this place of custody and this in violation of Article 151 of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta.

Having seen the consent of the Attorney General and of the defendant that these proceedings should be summary ones.

Having heard the defendant file a guilty plea in the sitting of the 3rd September 2009.

Having heard him confirm this guilty plea after having given him enough time to reflect on the consequences. Hence the charges have been proved in accordance with the law and the defendant is guilty as charged.

Conclusion

The Court, having seen Section 32(1)(c) of Chapter 217, 17(b), 151 and 181 of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta, finds the defendant guilty of all the charges against him.

As to the penalty, the Court is taking into consideration the fairly early guilty plea and also the Prosecution's declaration that the defendant has helped the Executive Police in a substantial way.

So the Court is condemning the defendant to 9 months imprisonment from which the period spent under arrest must be deducted.
