The Court;

After seeing the charges brought against:

Ederoin Resent, Nigerian National, born in Edo States, Nigeria in the year 1980, son of Ederoin and Mary, residing in St. Paul's Bay, known with Police No LLL-018; For Having:

1) On the 14th March 2010 in these islands forged, altered or tampered with a Residence Permit Card or used or had in his possession a Residence Permit Card which he knew to be forged, altered or tampered with, in the name of John Davidson bearing number E 11466701 Chapter 61, Sec 5 of the Laws of Malta;

2) And charge him also with having on same date, time and circumstances committed any other kind of forgery, or have knowingly made use of any other forged document, in the mentioned documents Chapter 9 Section 189 of the Laws of Malta;

3) And charge him also with having on same date, time and circumstances forged any document or true copy of a document or an entry made in pursuance of this act Chapter 217, Sec 32 (1d) of the Laws of Malta;

4) And charge him also with having become recidivist by committing another crime within five years of a sentence of the 26th September 2009 (Magt. Mizzi LLD) which became definitive of Chapter 9 Section 49, 50 of the Laws of Malta);

Considers:

After having seen Article 5 of Chapter 61 of the Laws of Malta;

Article 32(1)(d) of Chapter 217 of the Laws of Malta;

And Articles 189, 49 and 50 of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta;

After having seen the accused admit the charges brought against him, which admission was confirmed by him after having been given due time to reconsider in accordance with the law;

After having heard the evidence and the documents exhibited;

After having heard the accused's plea and after having given the time prescribed by Law for the accused to

consider his plea, this Court finds the said accused guilty as charged, and consequently condemns him to a term of six (6) months imprisonment.
