VS

FRIDAY UWANGHO aged 27 years, son of Uwangho and Iyoama, born in Nigeria on the 17.12.1982, residing at Hal-Far Tent Village, holder of Police no 08 DDD – 017;

The Court;

Seen charged brought against the above-mentioned **FRIDAY UWANGHO** who was charged of having in the months prior to the 23rd May, 2010, in Malta:

1. Forged, altered or tampered with any passport or used or had in his possession any passport which he

knew to be forged, altered or tampered with, in terms of Article 5 of Chapter 61 of the Laws of Malta;

2. Also of having without lawful authority used or had in their possession any forged document required for the purposes of the Immigration Act, in terms of Article 32(1)(f) of Chapter 217 of the Laws of Malta;

3. And also of having knowingly made use of the forged documents, that is Italian residence permit, Italian identity card and Italian Aliens' passport in terms of Article 189 of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta.

Seen Attorney General's consent for summary proceedings, to which accused declared that he had no objection;

Seen accused's early guilty plea at the stage of arraignment, and this after having been allowed due time by Court to re-consider same;

Seen all documents exhibited;

Heard parties treat the case.

Considered:

This Court thus finds accused guilty as charged and this after having seen Article 5 of Chapter 61 of the Laws of Malta, Article 32(1)(f) of Chapter 217 of the Laws of Malta and also Article 189 of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta, and condemns him to six (6) months imprisonment in terms of Article 17 of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta.
