The Police (Inspector Jesmond J. Borg) vs Donna Jane Griffiths

The Court;

Having seen the charges brought forward against **Donna Jane Griffiths**, 21 years of age, daughter of Malcolm and Carol *nee*' Brooks born in Manchester UK on the 23rd February 1989, residing in Malta at the Qawra Inn Hotel Room 464 and holder of British passport no. 111262963;

Wwith having on the 9th June 2010 and during the previous days, on these Islands:

Had in her possession the drugs (cocaine) specified in the First Schedule of the Dangerous Drug Ordinance, Chalter 101 of the Laws of Malta, when she was not in the

posession of an import and export authorization issued by the Chief Government Medical Officer in pursuance of the provisions of Paragraphs 4 and 6 of the Ordinance, and when she was not liscenced to manufacture or supply the mentioned drugs, and was not otherwise licensed by the President of Malta or authorised by the Internal Control of Dangerous Drugs Regulation (G.N. 292/1939) to be in the possession of the mentioned drugs was supplied to him for his personal use, according to a medical prescription as provided in the said regulations, and this in breach of the 1939 Regulations of the Internal Control of Dangerous Drugs (G.N, 292/1939) as subsequently amended by the Dangerous Drugs Ordinance Chapter 101 of the Laws of Malta;

The Court is also requested to apply Section 533 (1) of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta as regards to the expenses incurred by the Court appointed Experts;

Having heard the plea of guilt of the accused;

Finds the accused guilty as charged;

Having seen articles GN292/1939, Section 6, article 22 and Schedule 1 of Chapter 101 of the Laws of Malta;

Having seen the clean conduct sheet of the accused;

Discharges the accused with the specific condition that she does not commit any other offence within a period of one (1) year from today in terms of article 22 of Chapter 446 of the Laws of Malta.
