THE POLICE INSPECTOR MARIO HABER

VS

OSEMWENGIE MACPHERSON, Nigerian national, born in Nigeria on the 02.09.1988, son of Paul and Mary, known with police no 08BBBB – 107; And ERHAHOM LUCKY, Nigerian national, born in Benin City on the 29.08.1984, son of Erhahom and Joy, known with police number 07VV – 021;

The Court;

Seen charges brought against the above-mentioned **OSEMWENGIE MACPHERSON** and **ERHAHOM LUCKY** who were charged of having:

1. On the 5th September, 2010, in these Islands, forged, altered, or tampered with Residence Permit Cards or used or had in their possession such Residence Permit Cards which they knew to be forged, altered, or tampered with, in the name of Samuel Kelly bearing number E02276544, and in the name of Johnpaul Mulumba Esekwe bearing number E10390496 (Chap 61, Sec 5 of the Laws of Malta);

2. Also of having on the same date, time, and circumstances, committed any other kind of forgery, or have knowingly made use of any other forged document, in the mentioned documents (Chap 9, Sec 189 of the Laws of Malta);

3. And also of having on the same date, time, and circumstances, forged any document or true copy of a document or an entry made in pursuance of this act (Chap 217, Sec 32(1d) of the Laws of Malta).

Seen Attorney General's consent for summary procedures, to which accused both declared that they had no objection;

Heard early admission of both accused at the stage of their arraignment, and this after having been allowed due time by Court to re-consider their guilty plea;

Considered all other previous judgments given in this nature;

Seen the seriousness of the charges proffered against the accused.

Seen Section 5 of Chapter 61 of the Laws of Malta, Section 189 of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta, and also Section 32 of Chapter 217 of the Laws of Malta.

Considers:

This Court thus finds both accused guilty as charged, and condemns them to seven (7) months imprisonment each.
