The Police (Inspector Joseph Hersey)

Vs

Abdu Draman, son of Celu and Miam, born in Ivory Coast on the 01/02/89, having Police No 08FFF-022, and currently residing at Hal-Far Tent Village

The Court;

Having seen the charges brought against accused Abdu Darman who was charged with having on the 12th June 2011, as a person who embarked or disembarked from Malta, made or caused to be made a false return, false statement or false representation and/or furnished the Principal Immigration Officer with false information, and

this in violation of Article 32(1)(C) of Chapter 217 of the Laws of Malta.

Moreover, under the same circumstances knowingly falsified or made use of a forged document, being an Italian 'Titolo Di Viaggio Per Stranieri' no: 077291, and a 'Permesso Di Soggiorno' no: 100453496 and this in violation of Chap. 9 Sec. 189 of the Laws of Malta.

Having seen documents exhibited;

Having seen the Attorney General's consent for this case to be heard summarily by this Court;

Having heard the accused admit to the charges brought against him which admission was reaffirmed after the accused was given adequate time to reconsider same;

Having heard submission regarding the punishment to be inflicted;

Considers;

That in view of the guilty plea filed by accused Abdu Darman the Court cannot but find him guilty as charged.

That in considering the punishment to be inflicted the Court is taking into consideration the early guilty plea filed by the accused and the fact that he has no fixed place of residence and no ties with the country.

Consequently the Court after having seen Section 32(1)(c) of Chapter 217 and Section 189 of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta finds the accused guilty as charged and condemns him to a period of six (6) months imprisonment
