## The Police (Inspector Mario Haber)

VS

Ibrahim Cissoko, Ivorian National, born in Abijan, on the 12<sup>th</sup> January 1967, son of Dauda and Fatima, known with Police No 07YY-011

The Court;

Having seen charges brought against accused who was charged with having on the 1<sup>st</sup> August 2011 in these Islands forged, altered or tampered with a Passport, ID card and Residence Permit Card or used or had in his possession a Passport, ID card and Residence Permit Card which he knew to be forged, altered or tampered with, in his own name bearing numbers 9006326 and M00023792 respectively (Cap 61, Sec 5 of the Laws of Malta)

Also charged with having on the same date and circumstances while in Malta, committed any other king of forgery or knowingly made use of any forged document, in the mentioned documents (Cap 9, Sec 189 of the Laws of Malta)

Also charged with having on the same date and circumstances forged any document or true copy of a document or an entry made in pursuance of this act (Cap 217, Sec 32(1d) of the Laws of Malta)

Having seen documents exhibited;

Having seen the Attorney General's consent dated 2<sup>nd</sup> August, 2011, for the case to be dealt summarily by this Court;

Having heard accused plead guilty to the charges brought against him which guilty plea was reaffirmed after the accused was given adequate time to reconsider same.

Having heard submissions regarding the punishment to be inflicted;

## Considers;

That in view of the guilty plea filed by the accused the Court finds him guilty as charged.

That in considering the punishment to be inflicted the Court is taking into consideration the early guilty plea filed by the accused and the fact that the accused cooperated with the police during the course of investigations.

Consequently the Court after having seen section 5 of Chapter 6 of the Laws of Malta, section 189 of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta and section 32(1)(d) of Chapter 217 of the Laws of Malta finds accused guilty as charged and condemns him to a period of six (6) months imprisonment which period of imprisonment after having seen Section

28A of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta is being suspended for one (1) year from today

The Court warns the guilty person of the consequence according to law should he commit another crime during the operative period of this sentence.
