MOHAMED SALAD ABDUL RAMMAN

Sitting held today, 30th August 2011.

The Court

Having seen that the accused **MOHAMED SALAD ABDUL RAMMAN**, 22 years old, Somali national, born in 1989, son of Mohamed Salad and Aisha Mohammed, known with police number 09A-093, presently residing at Hal-Far Open Centre, was arraigned before her accused:-

1. With having during these last four months of this year (2011) and/or the previous days in Malta, made a false oath before an officer authorised by law to administer oaths.

- 2. And also with having on the same dates and the same circumstances while in Malta, knowingly made a false affidavit.
- 3. Moreover, also charged with having on the same dates and circumstances, while in Malta, knowingly made use of forged documents being the Maltese Identity Card and Immigration Certificate.
- 4. Also, with having on the same dates and circumstances in Malta, made use or attempted to make use of an Immigration Certificate and Identity Card issued to any other person.
- 5. And also, with having on the same dates and circumstances while in Malta, knowingly made a false statement in connection with the issue or renewal of a passport.
- 6. As well as with having on the same dates and circumstances as a person who embarked or disembarked from Malta, made use or caused to be made a false return, false statement or false representation and/or furnished the Principal Immigration Officer with false information.

Having seen all the documents exhibited in the acts of these proceedings by the Prosecution in particular the Consent of the Attorney General so that this case may be dealt with summarily, an official document issued by the Security Branch in Malta, a statement made by the accused and the Conviction Sheet of the accused.

Having heard the accused declare that he does not understand the Maltese language, the Court ordered that the proceedings be carried out in the English language according to Article 5 of the Judicial Proceedings Act.

Having heard the accused plead guilty to the charges brought forward against him.

The Court explained to the accused the consequences of his plea of guilt and after having given the accused sufficient time to reconsider his plea of guilt and saw that the same accused insisted on registering in the acts of these proceedings his plea of guilt, had no alternative but to register such plea.

In the light of the above plea of guilt, which guilty plea was made voluntarily, expressly and unconditionally, the Court is satisfied that the accused is to be found guilty of the charges brought forward against him.

Thus the Court having seen the relevant sections at law in particular Section 32 (1) (C) of Chapter 217, Sections 106(3), 108 (1) and 189 of Chapter 9 and Sections 4 and 6 of Chapter 61 of the Laws of Malta decides to find the accused MOHAMED SALAD ABDUL RAMMAN guilty of the charges brought against him by the prosecution and condemns him for a period of one (1) year imprisonment.
