## Mindia Manelishvili

Today, the 3<sup>rd</sup> of May, 2012

The Court,

Having seen that the accused Mindia Manelishvili, holder of Georgian passport number 05AC24968.

Was charged with having on the 2<sup>nd</sup> May 2012, and during the previous months before this date, in these islands:

1. Had in his possession the drugs (heroin) specified in the First Schedule of the Dangerous Drug Ordinance, Chapter 101 of the Law of Malta, when he was not in possession of an import or an export authorisation issued by the Chief Government Medical Officer in pursuance of the provisions of paragraphs 4 and 6 of the Ordinance, and when he was not licensed or otherwise authorised to manufacture or supply the mentioned drugs, and was not otherwise licensed by the President of Malta or authorised by the Internal Control of Dangerous Drugs Regulations (G.N. 292/1939) to be in possession of the mentioned drugs, and failed to prove that the mentioned drugs was supplied to him for his personal use, according to a medical prescription as provided in the said regulations, and this in breach of the 1939 Regulations, of the Internal Contol of Dangerous Drugs (G.N. 292/1939) subsequently amended by the Dangerous Ordinance Chapter 101 of the Laws of Malta.

After seeing all documentation, including the Order by the Attorney General in terms of subarticle (2) of Article 22 of Chapter 101 of the Laws of Malta;

And hearing guilty plea by the accused of the charge brought against him, and the confirmation of such plea after being given the faculty to reconsider his plea, and seeing Articles 4, 6 and 22(2) of Chapter 101 of the Laws of Malta and G.N. 292/1939, finds accused Mindia Manelishvili of the charge brought against him and by virtue of Article 22 of Chapter 466 frees him with the condition not to commit another offence within eighteen (18) months from today.

The Court orders the destruction of the drug exhibited by prosecution and marked as Dok MB1 and this under the surpevision of the Registrar of Courts.

Finally explained in simple words the repercussions if this order is not complied with.
