The Court,

Having seen the charges proffered against the defendant,  
namely:

1. with having in the months prior to the 28<sup>th</sup>  
November, 2011, in Malta embarked without being in  
possession of a passport and without furnishing the  
Principal Immigration Officer the prescribed information  
and such other information as the Principal Immigration  
Officer might have deemed proper to require;

2. with having committed an offence during the operative period of a suspended sentence delivered by the Court of Magistrates on the 26<sup>th</sup> May, 2011.

Having seen the records of the case of the 14<sup>th</sup> December, 2011 whereby the accused admitted to the charges as proffered.

Having seen the note filed by the Attorney General on the 3<sup>rd</sup> January, 2012 whereby the Attorney General declared that after having examined the record of proceeding held by this Court against the accused and having found that there may result an offence (or offences) under the provisions of:

- a. sections 28 and 32 of Chapter 217 of the Laws of Malta;
  - b. sections 28B and 28C of the Criminal Code;
  - c. sections 49 and 50 of the Criminal Code;
- transmitted the acts of this case to this Court to decide upon such offence or offences, subject to no objection being made by the accused.

Having seen the records of the case whereby the accused gave his consent that the case be tried summarily.

Consequently, the Court finds the accused guilty of the charges as proffered. Having seen sections 28 and 32 of Chapter 217 of the Laws of Malta and sections 49 and 50 of the Criminal Code condemns him to a term of imprisonment of one (1) month. Moreover, having seen the judgement of the Court of Magistrates against the accused of the 26<sup>th</sup> May, 2011. Having seen section 28B of the Criminal Code orders that such judgement be brought into operation and condemns the accused to a further period of six months imprisonment.
