When the case was called there appeared the accused who informed the Court that he understands the english language. The Court orders that proceedings be held in the english language.

The accused, of his own free will, declares that he does not want to be assisted by a lawyer.

The prosecuting officer filed, under oath, the filing of the report.

**The accused, of his own free will pleads guilty to all the charges brought against him by the police.**

**THE COURT**

Having seen the charges brought by the police against Filip Filipov namely that he has, during the past months, without having been granted a residence permit, landed or was in Malta without leave from the Principal Immigration Officer and furthermore with being unable to show that he has

means to support himself and is thus liable to become a charge on public funds.

Having seen the request of the prosecution for the Court, besides awarding the punishment prescribed by law, to declared the said Filip Filipov as a prohibited immigrant and issue a removal order against him from these islands .

**Having heard the accused of his own free will, declare that he is guilty to all the charges brought against him.**

Finds him guilty of having, during the past months, without having been granted a residence permit, landed or was in Malta without leave from the Principal Immigration Officer and furthermore with being unable to show that he has means to support himself and is thus liable to become a charge on public funds.

Having seen the relative articles of the Immigration Act namely Article 6 (1), (b) (c) together with Article 15 of Chapter 217 of the Laws of Malta.

As regards to punishment, the Court, after having heard the parties concerned, feels that it should not apply that stipulated by law, and instead, by application of Section 9 of Chapter 152 of the Laws of Malta, orders that the accused be set free on condition that he does not commit any further offence within a period of six months from today.

In addition the Court orders the issue of the attached removal order against the same accused.
