Today, the 11th of January, 2013

The Court,

Having seen the charges brought against Boy Eghie, of 37 years of age, son of Eghie and Rose, born in Edo States, Nigeria, on the 2nd December, 1975 and residing at Hal Far, Tent Village Open Centre, Hal Far, Malta and holder of immigration Police Number 08BBBB-44.

Charged with having in 2010, later months in Malta, landed or embarked from Malta without being in possession of a passport and have not furnished to the Principal Immigration Officer the prescribed information and such other information as the Principal Immigation Officer may deem proper to require, and this in violation of article 28 of Chapter 217 of the Laws of Malta.

Having seen section 28 of Chapter 217 of the Laws of Malta.

Having seen the order of the Attorney General for this case to be tried summarily and that the defendant had no objection to the case being so tried.

Having heard the defendant plead guilty to the charge brought against him and confirm this admission of guilt even after having been given time to reconsider his plea.

Having seen the documents filed by the prosecuting office.

Having heard submissions regarding the penalty to be meted out.

Having considered

The defendat admitted the charge brought against him; this is consequently sufficiently proved.

With regard to the penalty to be meted out the Court took into consideration the nature of the offence of which the defendant is being found guilty, his co-operation with the police, and his admission at the earliest stage of these proceedings.

Wherefore the Court, after having seen section 28 of Chapter 217 of the Laws of Malta, on his admission finds defendant guilty of the charge brought against him and condemns him to three months imprisonment which by application on of section 28A of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta are being suspended for a period of eighteen months.

The Court explained to the defendant in ordinary language the significance of this judgement and of the consequences should he commit an other offence in the period of eighteen months.
