THE POLICE INSPECTOR JESSICA GRIMA

VS

NKEONYENASOA TIMOTHY ONWUDEG

The Court:

Having seen the accusations brought against the accused Nkeonyenasoa Timothy Onwudeg holder of Identity Card Number 65497A.

Accused that:

Having on these Maltese Islands, on the 12th of March, 2013, and the days before Saint Paul's Bay:

1. Assaulted or resisted by violence or active force not amounting to public violence, persons lawfully charged

with a public duty when in the execution of the law or of a lawful order issued by a competent authority;

- 2. After having the responsibility of your son Destiny Bright Onwedugu under twelve years of age, by means of persistent acts of commission or omission ill-treated the child or caused or allowed the ill-treatment by similar means of the child;
- 3. Used violence in order to compel another person to do, suffer or omit anything;
- 4. Without the intent to kill or to put the life of any person in manifest jeopardy, caused slight bodily harm on his son Destiny Bright Onwudegu, as certified by Dr. Lynn Grech, bearing the medical registration number 3227;
- 5. Wilfully disturbed the public good order or the public peace.

Read the documents and accusations;

Heard the evidence produced under oath;

After having seen Articles 96 (a), 221, 222 (1) (b), 247 A, 251 and 338 (dd) of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta.

The Court considers that the accused voluntarily and unconditionally admitted the charges brought against him by the prosecution, which left the Court with no alternative but to find the accused guilty as charged.

Therefore, the Court conditionally discharges the accused for a period of three (3) years in terms of Article 22 of Chapter 446 of the Laws of Malta.

The Court explained the consequences of the judgement to the accused.
