David James Wilson

The Court,

After having seen the charges brought against **David James Wilson**, born in Liverpool on the 26th January 1967 and residing at 7022, Blue Sea, La Vallette Resort, Dragonara Road, Saint Julians, Malta and holder of Passport Number 099106784,

charged with having on the night between 04th of March 2014 and 05th of March 2014, whilst being in St. Julian's and on these Islands:

1. attempted to use force against Sandro Di Murro and Rosario Di Murro with intent to insult, annoy or hurt such persons or others in breach of Article 339(1)(d) of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta;
2. on the same date, time, place and circumstances, wilfully disturbed the public good order or the public peace in breach of Article 338(m) of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta;
3. on the same date, time, place and circumstances, was found drunk and incapable of taking care of himself in breach of Article 338(ff) of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta;
4. on the same date, time, place and circumstances uttered insults or threats towards Sandro Di Murro and Rosario Di Murro in breach of Article 339(1)(e) of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta.

Having examined all the documents forming part of the proceedings.

Having heard the accused plead guilty to the charges brought against him, notwithstanding the fact that the Court in terms of Section 453(1) of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta warned him in the most solemn manner of the legal consequences of his guilty plea after having given him sufficient time within which to reconsider and withdraw his guilty plea.

Considers

That, as a consequence of the admission of the accused of the charges brought against him, the Court finds the accused guilty of the said charges.

With regards to the punishment to be inflicted, the Court will be taking into consideration various factors, including the nature of the charges brought against the accused and his guilty plea at an early stage of these proceedings.

Therefore, the Court, after having seen and considered Sections 338(ff), 338(m), 339(1)(d) and 339(1)(e) of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta, finds the accused David James Wilson guilty of all the charges brought against him, and in terms of Section 22 of Chapter 446 of the Laws of Malta the Court is conditionally discharging the accused subject to the condition that he does not commit another offence within a period of six (6) months from date of this judgement.

In terms of Section 22(3) of Chapter 446 of the Laws of Malta the Court explained to the accused in ordinary language what

are the consequences if he commits another offence during the said period of six (6) months from date of this judgement.
