The Court:

Having seen the accusations brought against the accused Tina Brlec, holder of Slovenian Identity card number 003037556.

Accused that:

Having on these islands of the 31st of May 2014 at about three in the morning (03:00hrs) in the St. Julians Police Station and / or in the vicinity:

Laid before the Executive Police ab information regarding an offence knowing that such offence has not been committed, or falsely devised the traces of an offence in such a manner that criminal proceeding may be instituted for the ascertainment of such offence.

The Court:

Read the documents and accusations;

Heard the evidence produced under oath;

After having seen Article 110 (2) of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta.

The Court considers that the accused voluntarily and unconditionally admitted the charges brought against her by the prosecution, which left the Court with no alternative but to find the accused guilty as charged.

Therefore, the Court conditionally discharges the accused for a period of two (2) years in terms of Article 22 of Chapter 446 of the Laws of Malta.

The Court explained the consequences of the judgement to the accused.
