

COURT OF MAGISTRATES (MALTA) AS A COURT OF CRIMINAL JUDICATURE MAGISTRATE DR. CAROL PERALTA

ABDIMALIK AHMED MOHAMMED

The Court:

Having seen the accusations brought against the accused Abdimalik Ahmed Mohammed, holder of Immigration document number 12U-049 and ID card number 82438A.

Accused that:

Having on the 13th of January 2015 at approximately half past two in the afternoon (14:30hrs) at Hal-Far and / or other localities in Malta:

- Reviled, threaten and caused a bodily harm to Albert Cauchi, a person lawfully charged with a public duty, while in the act of discharging his duty or because of his having discharged such duty, or with intent to intimidate or unduly influence him in the discharge of such duty;
- 2. On the same day, at the same time and place and in the same circumstances, threatened other persons with stones or hard objects and threw them to persons or took up arms against same;
- 3. On the same day, at the same time and place and in the same circumstances, attempted to use force against any person with intent to insult, annoy or hurt such person or others;
- 4. On the same day, at the same time and place and in the same circumstances, committed a crime during the operative period of a suspended sentence as per judgement dated 20th August 2013 delivered by Magistrate Dr. P. Coppini (Court of Magistrates, Gozo).
- On the same day, at the same time and place and in the same circumstances, committed a crime during the period of conditional discharge as per sentence dated 21st November 2013 delivered by Magistrate Dr. N. Camilleri (Court of Magistrates, Malta);
- 6. On the same day, at the same time and place and in the same circumstances, committed a crime punishable with imprisonment and thus failed to observe one or more of the conditions imposed by the Court of Magistrate in its decree granting bail.

The Court:

Read the documents and accusations;

Informal Copy of Judgement

Heard the evidence produced under oath;

After having seen Articles 28B, 95, 339b, 339d, 383, 412c and 579 of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta and Articles 22 and 23 of Chapter 446 of the Laws of Malta.

The Court after taking in consideration the admission of the accused;

The Court explained the consequences of the judgement to the accused.

On admission, the Court proceeds to give sentence and condemns the accused for a period of eight (8) effective months imprisonment and extends the conditions of the suspended sentence given by this Court differently presided on the 20th of August 2013, for a period of twelve (12) months imprisonment suspended for two (2) years with effect from the 22nd of January 2015. In terms of Article 95 of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta, the Court condemns the same accused to pay a fine of four thousand euros (€4,000) within a period of six (6).
