The Court;

After seeing the charges brought against;

Pa Mustapha Abdulai Ndure son of Abdulai and Saye nee' Drameh, born on the 6th January 1980, resides at San Antonio Hotel, Room 248, St Paul's Bay and holder of passport no, 532857170;

And

Sylwia Szymezak, daughter of Andrzey and Beata nee' Stanezyk, born on the 4th November 1987 Poland resides at San Antonio Hotel, Room 248 St Paul's Bay and holder of passport no. EE 3754298;

With having in these islands on the 11th October 2015 at about ten past six in the morning 06.10am from inside Cabs Plus, Marguerite Mangion Street, St Julian's and/or in the vicinity;

- 1) Committed theft of a bag containing a mobile phone make Samsung costing €690, €192 in cash, a pair of spectacles, a data track chip, several bank credit cards and personal documents to the detriment of Harry Vella and/or other persons, and/ or other entities which theft is aggravated by amount which exceeds €232.94 but does not exceed €2329.37 and time;
- 2) Accuse them further for having on the same date at about 7.00am in, these islands stole €600 in cash to the detriment of Harry Vella, HSBC Bank and/ or other persons and or other entities which theft is aggravated by means and by amount which exceeds €232.94 but does not exceed €2329.37 and time;

Considers;

After having seen Articles 261 (c), (f), 267, 270, 279(a), 261(b)(c), 263(a), 267, 279(a) of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta;

After having heard the evidence and the documents exhibited;

After having heard the accused admit the charges brought against them, which admission was confirmed by them after having been given time to reconsider in accordance with the law;

The Court finds the said accused guilty as charged and condemns them to a punishment of one (1) year imprisonment suspended for two (2) years in accordance with the provisions of Articles 28A of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta.

The Court explained in clear words the terms of the judgement to the accused.
