The Court:

Having seen that the offender **Zubair Fathi Mohamed Ramadan** was charged with having, on the 27th October 2016, at around 05:00hrs, in St. George's Street, St. Julian's:

Wilfully committed damage to vehicle of make Mitsubishi with registration number CBL086, to the detriment of David Attard (ID: 542181M) which damage amounts to six hundred and twenty three Euros and twenty one cents (€623.21c).

Having seen that the acts of the proceedings;

Having heard the offender plead guilty to the charge brought against him, which guilty plea was reconfirmed after the Court gave him time to reconsider such plea;

Having heard the submissions regarding the penalty to be meted out.

Having considered:

That offender admitted the charge brought against him and hence it is consequently sufficiently proved;

Regarding the penalty to be meted out the Court took into consideration the nature of the offence of which the offender is being found guilty and his admission at the earliest stage of these proceedings and his clean conviction sheet.

The Court also took into consideration the fact that the offender has declared that he is ready to pay the damages he caused to David Attard.

Wherefore the Court, after having seen section 325 (1) (b) of the Criminal Code, on his admission finds the offender **Zubair Fathi Mohamed Ramadan** guilty of the charge brought against him and **conditionally discharges him under the provision of Section 22 (1) of Chapter 446 of the Laws of Malta on condition that he commits no offence during the period of two (2) years as from today.**

In terms of section 24 (1) of Chapter 446 of the Laws of Malta, the Court is also ordering the offender to pay the injured party David Attard the sum of six hundred and twenty three euro and twenty one cents (€623.21c) within a period of six (6) months from today

Finally the Court is giving **Zubair Fathi Mohamed Ramadan** the explanation prescribed in Section 22(3) of Chapter 446 of the Laws of Malta.
