Aleksander Jevremovic

The Court,

Having seen the charges against Alekander Jevremovic and holder of Passport number 008332255.

Charged with having on the 26th of January, 2017 at around 00:05hrs, in St. George's Street, St Julian's acted as a private guard or offer his services as such, without having the necessary licence with the provisions of this Act;

Also charged with having, on the same date, at around 00:45hrs, in St.Julian's Police station and its vicinities in St George's Street disobeyed the lawful orders of any authority or of any person entrusted with a public service, or hindered or obstructed such person in the exercise of his duties or otherwise unduly interfered with the exercise of such duties, either by

preventing other persons from doing what they are lawfully enjoined or allowed to do or frustrating or undoing what has been lawfully done by other persons, or in any other manner whatsoever.

Having heard defendant admit the charges brought against him.

Having seen the acts of the proceedings.

Having heard the submissions regarding the penalty to be meted out.

Having considered

The defendant admitted the charges brought against him; these are consequently sufficiently proved.

With regards the penalty to be meted out the Court took into consideration the nature of the charges, defendant's cooperation with the police, his admission at the earliest stage of the proceedings and his clean conviction sheet.

Wherefore the Court after having seen sections 338(ee) of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta and section 3(b) of Chapter 389 of the Laws of Malta, on his admission finds defendant guilty of the charges brought against him and condemns him to three months imprisonment which by application of section 28A of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta are being suspended for a period of eighteen months.

The Court explained to the defendant in ordinary language the significance of this judgement and of the consequences should he commit an other offence in the period of eighteen months.
