Jacqueline Spiteri

The Court,

Having seen the charges brought against the accused Jacqueline Spiteri 50 years, wife of Luigi, daughter of Ronald Dimock and Clara Reithmuller, date of birth 13.12.51, Kensington U.K. and residing at No. 52, St. Angelo Street, Sliema, Holder of ID Card Number 996(A) being charged with having:

a) on 7th August 2002 in these islands in order to gain any advantage or benefit for herself or others, in any

document intended for any public authority, knowingly made a false declaration or statement, or gave false information to the Executive Police, in breach of Section 188 of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta;

b) fraudulently caused any fact or circumstance to exist, or to appear to exist, in order that such fact or circumstance may afterwards be proved in evidence against another person, with intent to procure such other person to be unjustly charged with, or convicted of, any offence, this in breach of Section 110(1) of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta;

c) laid before the Executive Police an information regarding an offence knowing that such offence had not been committed, or falsely devised the traces of an offence in such a manner that criminal proceedings may be instituted for the ascertainment of such offence, in breach of Section 110(2) of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta.

Considers:

That in virtue of the admission of the accused given voluntarily and unconditionally and in which accused persisted even after having been given time to reflect to a plea of guilty.

The Court having seen Sections 188, 110(1), 110(2), 17 of Chapter 9. Having seen the relative conduct sheet and considered the circumstances acquits the accused by application of Article 7 of Chapter 446 for one year and appoints a probation officer.
