Paul Alfred Nosworthy

The Court,

Accused Paul Alfred Nosworthy, holder of British Passport number, 206053109, is charged with:

Having on the 22nd of January 2005, at about 7:00 p.m., whilst inside the Mc Donalds Restaurant situated in Republic Street Valletta, with intent to commit a crime, namely theft of bag containing money and other items, to the detriment of Nazzarena Spiteri, manifested such intents by overt acts followed by a commencement of the

execution of the crime, which crime was not completed in consequence of some accidental cause independent of the will of the offender, in breach of Section 41 (1) (a) of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta;

Accused for having on the same date, time, place and circumstances, without intent to kill or to put the life of any person in manifest jeopardy, caused grievous bodily harm on the person of Nazzarena Spiteri, in breach of Section 214, 215 and 216 (1) (a) (iii) of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta;

Accused for having on the same date, time, place and circumstances,

1. at night time, disturbed the repose of the inhabitants by rowdiness or bawling, or in any other manner; in breach of Section 338 (m) of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta;

2. attempting to use force against any person with intent to insult, annoy or hurt such person or others, in breach of Section 339 (d) of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta;

3. ran violently in any street or open space, with the risk of running into and injuring other persons, in breach of Section 338(cc) of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta.

4. attempting to use force against any person with intent to insult, annoy or hurt such person or others, in breach of Section 339(d) of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta;

5. having uttered, insulted or threatened Nazzarena Spiteri, in breach of Section 339 (e) of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta;

6. having pushed against a person in the street with the object of hurting or insulting Nazzarena Spiteri.

Having heard the accused plead guilty to the charges brought against him on which plea of guilt the accused insisted even after the Court allowed reasonable time for him to reconsider.

Informal Copy of Judgement

Having seen the minutes of the sitting of the 7th of February, 2005.

Having seen the injured third party in person and ascertained the injuries.

Having considered the accused's mental condition from the minutes of the records of the proceedings.

Proceeds to give judgement by declaring the accused guilty of the charges proffered against him. Having seen Articles 95, 96, 214, 215, 216 (1) (a) (iii), 338(m)(cc), 339 (d)(e) and 17 of Chapter 9 decides to conditionally discharge him for three years from today by application of article 22 Chapter 446.
