KAYLUM SHAMUS TAYLOR

The Court,

Having seen the charges brought against the accused Kaylum Shamus Taylor, of 18 years, son of Barry Bark and Pauline nee' Taylor, born in the United Kingdom on the 29th January 1988, and residing at Speranza Building, Block A, Flat 4, Taz-Zokkrija, limits of Mosta, and holder of identity card number 37126(A), and charge him with having on the 16th October 2006 at about 11.45pm, whilst at Mosta, caused willful damages on vehicle, bearing number EBB 237, make Daihatsu Charade, the estimation of which exceeds the fifty Maltese Lira (Lm50), but less than five hundred Maltese Lira (Lm500), to the detriment of Carmel Micallef from Mosta.

Moreover, for having on the same date, time and place, assaulted Joseph Falzon and caused injuries of slight nature as certified by Dr N.J. Vassallo M.D. of Mosta Health Centre, and for having disturbed the public good order and peace.

Furthermore, whilst at the Mosta Police Station, assaulted and resisted by violence or active force PS 698 Shawn Tabone, and PC 111 Mark Anthony Camilleri, who are persons lawfully charged with a public duty when they were in execution of the law or of a lawful order issued by a competent authority.

Having heard the evidence tendered on oath;

Having seen the record of the proceedings;

Having heard the plea of guilt registered by the accused (at page 2);

Having heard the confirmation of the same plea of guilt registered by the accused, after he was given adequate time to reconsider his plea;

Having heard the oral submissions of the parties;

Considers:-

On his same admission, the Court finds the accused Kaylum Shamus Taylor guilty as charged, and after having seen Articles 325, 221 and 96 of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta, and Article 7 of Chapter 446, places the accused under a probation order for a period of three (3) years, under the surveillance of the Director of Probation Services or Probation Officer appointed by the same. In awarding punishment, the Court has taken into consideration the plea of guilt registered early in the proceedings by the accused and the young age of the same accused.
