The Court,

Having seen the charges proffered against the accused, namely,

1. with having, at Sliema, on the 24th October, 2000 at about 11.00 a.m., mis-applied, converting to his own profit or to the benefit of any other person, the sum of about Lm2,800 which had been entrusted or delivered to him under a title which implied an obligation to return such thing or to make the use thereof for a specific purpose.

The Court has been requested, in case of conviction, to deal with the accused as a prohibited immigrant under section 15 of Chapter 217 of the Laws of Malta and declare same as a prohibited immigrant and issue a removal order against him.

Having seen the note filed by the Attorney General on the 25th October, 2000 whereby he gave his consent that this case be dealt with summarily.

Having seen the records of the proceedings held on the 27th October, 2000 whereby the Court was informed that the money had been returned to its rightful owner.

Having seen the records of the proceedings held on the 27th October, 2000 whereby the accused to the charge as proffered.

Consequently, the Court finds him guilty of the charge as proffered. Having seen sections 293 and 294 of the Criminal Code condemns him for a term of imprisonment for one year, but having seen section 28A of the Criminal Code orders that such punishment be suspended for a period of two years on condition that he does not commit a further offence which is punishable by imprisonment. Moreover, having seen

section 15 of Chapter 217 of the Laws of Malta declares the accused a prohibited immigrant and orders his removal from these Islands.
