PHILIP ANTHONY POOLEY

The Court;

Having seen the charges brought against Philip Anthony Pooley aged 41 years, son of Albert and Marelyn nee' Jenkins, born in Cardiff, Wales on the 12th of March, 1966, residing at no 7, Relf Road, Rhymney, Cardiff Wales, or Room 213, Etran Hotel, Marsascala, holder of passport bearing number 800257894;

1. Accused of having on the 23rd August, 2007 at about 3.45am, whilst he was at Jumping Jack's Bar, situated at Triq il-Qaliet, Marsascala, without the intent to kill or to put the life of any person in manifest

jeopardy, caused harm to the body or health of another person or caused to such other person a mental derangement in breach of Article 214 of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta;

2. Also of having on the same date, time, place and circumstances caused grievous bodily harm to Jonathan Bugeja from Marsaxlokk as certified by DR N Aquilina MD Reg no 2807 from St Luke's Hospital, in breach of Articles 216, 216 of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta;

3. Also of having on the same date, time, place, and circumstances offended Jonathan Bugeja by words, gestures, or in any other manner in breach of Article 252(1) of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta;

4. Also of having on the same date, time, place, and circumstances used force against Jonathan Bugeja with intent to insult, annoy or hurt such person in breach of Article 339(1)(d)(i) of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta;

5. Also of having on the same date, time, place, and circumstances uttered, insulted, or threatened or for being provoked, carried his insults beyond the limit warranted by the provocation in breach of Article 339(1)(e) of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta;

6. And finally of having on the same date, time, place, and circumstances in any manner willfully disturbed the public good order and peace in breach of Article 338(dd) of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta.

After having seen the documents exhibited;

Having heard the accused plead guilty as charged, after having been given due time according to Law to reconsider his admission;

Informal Copy of Judgement

Having seen Articles 214, 216, 218, 252(1), 339(1)(d)(e)(i), and 338(dd) of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta.

Considers:

This Court finds the said accused guilty as charged, and therefore condemns him to a period of two (2) years imprisonment, suspended for four (4) years, according to Article 28A of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta;
Moreover, this Court orders the said accused to pay the sum of Lm1,000.00 (one thousand maltese liri) to Jonathan Bugeja within two (2) months, in terms of Article 28H of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta.
