**Ahmed Mohammed Manda 25 years of age,  
Nationality Somalia, Daughter of Ahmed Mohammed  
and Amina Ali, born in Somalia in 1985, Residing at  
Hal-Far Open Centre, Police Boat number 09G-006**

The Court;

Having seen the charges brought against the accused Ahmed Mohammed Manda who is charged with having on the 12.04.2010 and/or the previous days in Malta, forged altered or tempered with passports/s or used or had in her possession a passport/s which she knew to be forged, altered or tempered with, one (1) Italian Identity card and one (1) Italian Residence Permits. *Chap 61 Sec 5.*

Also charged with having on the same date and circumstances while in Malta, knowingly made use of forged documents being the above mentioned passport/identity card and residence permit. *Chap 9 Sec 189.*

Also charged with having on the same date and circumstances and/or the previous days in Malta, made use of a false statement or false representation and/or furnished the principal immigration officers with false information. *Chap 217 Sec 32(c).*

Having seen documents exhibited;

Having heard the accused admit to the charges brought against her which admission was reaffirmed after the Court gave adequate time to the accused to reconsider same.

Having heard submissions regarding to the punishment to be inflicted;

Considers,

That in view of the guilty plea filed by the accused, the Court finds accused guilty as charged;

That in considering the punishment to be inflicted the Court is taking into consideration the early guilty plea filed by the accused and above all the fact that the accused is three months pregnant and consequently in the circumstances an effective prison term would not be beneficial to the accused and her unborn child.

Consequently the Court after having seen Section 5 of Chapter 61 of the Laws of Malta, Section 189 of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta and Section 32(1) (c) of Chapter 217 of the Laws of Malta finds accused guilty as charged and condemns her to a period of six (6) months imprisonment which period of imprisonment in view of the above made

considerations and after having seen Section 28A of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta is being suspended for four years from today.#

The Court warns the accused of the consequences according to law should she commit another crime during the term of this sentence.
