The Court

Having seen the European Arrest Warrant issued by the Judicial Authorities of the United Kingdom against Paul John Newall, hereinafter known as "the person", where it is stated that the same person is wanted by the above mentioned Judicial Authority as a Scheduled Country in terms of article 5 of Legal Notice 320 of 2004 for the offence of harassment, which offence is listed as scheduled according to Schedule 2 of the same legal

notice and with respect to which his surrender to the United Kingdom is being sought.

Having seen the certificate issued by the Attorney General in accordance with article 7 of Legal Notice 320 of 2004.

Having seen the request for the extradition of the same person to the above mentioned Judicial Authority.

Having seen all the acts relative to this case.

## Having considered

That, as can be seen from the record of the sitting held in the 3<sup>rd</sup> of August 2010, the same person <u>voluntarily</u>, informed the Court, in the presence of his defence counsel that he would like to submit himself to the foreign Judicial Authority involved and is <u>consenting</u>, of his own free will to his extradition to the United Kingdom without renouncing to the rule of speciality in accordance with article 43(3) of the above mentioned Legal Notice.

Therefore the Court, in accordance with article 45(3)(a) of Legal Notice 320 of 2004, orders that Paul John Newall as described in the European Arrest Warrant, be kept in custody to await his extradition to the United Kingdom, which is to take place within ten (10) days from today.

This Order is being made subject to the following:-

a) As already stated above, the person involved has not renounced to the rule of speciality and, therefore, the same Order is being issued provided that he is tried in regards to the offence specified and described in the European Arrest Warrant.

b) Having seen articles 25 and 15(5) of the same Legal Notice together with article 16 of Chapter 276 of the Laws of Malta, the Court is informing the person that if he feels that his human rights, have been, are being or are going to be infringed he has a right of redress under article 46 of the Constitution of Malta and/or under Chapter 319 of the Laws of Malta.
